Although only 35 years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has been a pioneer in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. **Gary F. Karner
Commissioner**

Dr. Gary Karner is entering his 13th year as the commissioner of the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC), a Division III conference consisting of nine institutions from within the University of Wisconsin System. His first major undertaking as commissioner was to merge the former Wisconsin State University Conference and Wisconsin Women’s Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, which had functioned as separate men’s and women’s conferences for over 25 years, into the WIAC.

During his tenure as commissioner, the WIAC has solidified its status as the premier Division III conference in the country as evidenced by the 42 NCAA National Championships the conference has captured over the past 12 years.

Karner also has directed a number of highly successful initiatives including the establishment of the WIAC Corporate Partner Program, a conference web site, a comprehensive sportsmanship program, as well as events such as the “Border Battle” and the WIAC Men’s and Women’s Postseason Basketball Tournament. Most recently, Karner achieved another milestone by brokering an agreement to have selected WIAC events (including all of the conference championships) televised on a regional sports network (FSN Wisconsin) - the first-ever such agreement in the history of Division III athletics.

Prior to becoming the commissioner of the WIAC, Karner spent nearly eight years with the NCAA national office as a compliance representative. During his tenure with the NCAA, he played a key role in the development of the institutional compliance review process as well as the NCAA Division I Athletic Certification Program. He also served as a NCAA liaison to a number of NCAA committees, the PAC-10, Big Sky, WAC and Big West conferences, and the College Football Association (CFA).

Karner also spent nearly 13 years in public education as a teacher, coach, and administrator in Wisconsin and Colorado. He earned his bachelor’s degree from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point in 1975 and his master’s and doctorate from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1978 and 1984, respectively.

Karner has served as the president of the National Association of Division III Athletic Administrators as well as on the executive committee of the NCAA Division III Commissioner’s Association, the NCAA Interpretations and Legislation Committee and the NADIII AA Sportsmanship and Ethical Conduct Committee. He is a current member of the NCAA Division III Baseball Committee.

In addition, Fiedler has officiated high school football for over 30 years, including five Wisconsin high school state championship games. Since 2002, he has served as a timer/TV liaison for the Big 10 Conference.

He began officiating men's basketball in the WIAC in 1982. He also officiated women's basketball in the conference from 1979-2000. He officiated in the WIAC men's basketball tournament seven years, as well as numerous NCAA men's and women's tournament contests, including three NCAA Division III women's final fours. Fiedler continues to be an active collegiate basketball official.

Fiedler has served as commissioner of the Big Rivers Conference since 1990, assigning officials for 11 high school sports played within the conference.

A resident of Eau Claire, Wis., Fiedler earned a bachelor's degree from UW-Eau Claire in 1973 and doctorate degree from the University of Minnesota in 1994. He has been a public school administrator in Wisconsin since 1978 and currently serves as the district administrator for the School District of New Auburn.



Mark Braden
Coordinator of Women's Basketball Officials

Mark Braden has served as the league's Coordinator of Women's Basketball Officials for 18 years. Braden has been involved with women's college basketball for 23 seasons and has worked numerous NCAA Tournament games, twice working the Championship game of the Elite Eight, along with the 1998 NCAA Division III Final Four. He has worked the Great Midwest (1995), MCC (1996, 1997), Horizon (2000, 2001) and the Mid-Continent Conference (2002) Postseason Tournaments. Braden has worked on the staff of the WIAC, Lake Michigan, Midwest, Great Lakes Valley, Mid-Continent, Conference USA, Horizon and Big Ten Conferences.

Braden began his officiating career in 1975, officiating freshman and sophomore football and basketball. He has officiated college football in the WIAC for 22 seasons. Braden has also worked numerous high school playoff games, along with five state high school championship games and the 1996 and 2003 Shrine All-Star games. He has officiated high school basketball for 21 years and has worked numerous WIAA Tournament games, along with the State Boys High School All-Star Game.

Braden attended UW-Madison and was a linebacker on the 1971 football team. He pursued a history major with a business minor before transferring to UW-Whitewater to complete his requirements for Dental School. In 1980, he graduated from Marquette University with a Doctor of Dental Surgery. He set up his General Dentistry practice in Lake Geneva, Wis. that same year.



Julie Voeck
Coordinator of Women's Volleyball Officials

Julie Voeck was named WIAC Coordinator of Women's Volleyball Officials in July, 2001. Voeck also serves as the coordinator of volleyball officials for the Lake Michigan Conference and Midwest Conference.

Voeck is the Officials Training Camp Director for the Professional Administration of Volleyball Officials (PAVO) - the national training and certification organization for volleyball officials. She is also the Referee Chair for the Badger Region, a local region of USA Volleyball.

Voeck is a National PAVO and USAV volleyball referee, as well as an international volleyball referee candidate. She is on the volleyball referee staff for the following conferences: WIAC, Lake Michigan, Midwest, Big 10, Horizon, Conference USA and Missouri Valley. Her postseason experience includes officiating the first round and regionals of the 2003 NCAA Division I Tournament and first round of 2003 and 2004 NCAA Division III Tournament. Voeck officiated the conference tournaments for Conference USA in 2002 and the Missouri Valley in 2004. She line-judged for the 2000 NCAA Division I Tournament finals and the 2001 Division III Tournament finals.

Voeck holds a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering and obtained a master's degree in business administration in 1994. She is Manager, Regulatory Policy and Strategic Planning for American Transmission Company, an energy delivery company in Wisconsin.



Eric Bertun
Coordinator of Women's
Soccer Officials

Eric Bertun was named WIAC Coordinator of Women's Soccer Officials in October, 2003. He is a certified referee assignor by the National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association (NISOA).

As a NCAA Division I soccer official for 18 years, Bertun has worked numerous NCAA Tournament and conference championship matches, including twice as the center referee for the WIAC championship match.

After playing top-level amateur soccer for many years, Bertun began officiating in Virginia in 1989 where he quickly ascended to NCAA Division I status, working matches in the ACC, Colonial and Sunbelt Conferences. Bertun moved to Madison in 1993 and began working Big 10, Conference USA and Big East matches.

Bertun has officiated many high school tournaments; being selected four times as the center referee for the WIAA Division I state championship match. He is a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) State Level referee, assessor and instructor. Bertun holds a USSF National "D" coaching license.

Bertun received a bachelor of science in biology from Christopher Newport University (Va.) and served as a graduate research assistant while studying sports medicine at Old Dominion University (Va.). In 2005, Bertun completed all coursework at Edgewood College to become certified as a secondary level broadfield science teacher.



Jim Doden
Coordinator of
Baseball Umpires

Jim Doden was named WIAC Coordinator of Baseball Umpires in October, 2003. He has officiated in many capacities for the conference, including 31 years as a baseball umpire, 27 years as a basketball referee and 19 years as a football official.

In addition to his experience with the WIAC, Doden has served as a Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) official for 43 years. He has been the conference commissioner for the Valley 8 Conference since 1998 and the Fox Valley Association since 2000.

Doden is a member of the National Education Association (NEA), Association of Wisconsin School Administrators (AWSA), Wisconsin Association of School Business Officials (WASBO), National Association of Sports Officials (NASO) and Green Bay Officials Association (GBOA).

Doden received a bachelor of science degree in math and physical education from UW-La Crosse in 1970. He was a member of the Eagle baseball team from 1967-70.



Rick Shomion
Coordinator of Women's
Softball Umpires

Rick Shomion was named WIAC Coordinator of Women's Softball Umpires in October, 2003.

Shomion has been umpiring collegiate softball for 23 years and has worked numerous NCAA Division III regional tournaments and Amateur Softball Association national tournaments. He has also worked three state softball tournaments for the Minnesota State High School League.

Shomion also officiates boys and girls high school hockey in Minnesota and works collegiate women's hockey contests. He has worked two boys and two girls state high school hockey tournaments, including the first-ever state girls tournament.

Shomion received a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Minnesota in 1986. He earned his master's degree in organizational leadership from the College of St. Catherine (Minn.) in 2002. Shomion is the Maintenance Training Coordinator for the Minnesota Department of Transportation.

Wisconsin State University Conference Historical Review

An organizational meeting of the Wisconsin State University Athletic Conference, then to be known as the State Normal Conference, was held in Madison in July of 1913. The two-fold purpose of this meeting was to secure for each school a schedule of games and to establish rules to regulate and control athletic competition within the proposed conference. The basic purposes of the rules have been to limit and control competition to bona fide students who are making regular progress in their studies toward a diploma or degree; to insure faculty control of athletics; and to promote harmony among the members. With the exception of a short period during World War II, the conference has maintained a regular schedule of games.

The schools represented at the organizational meeting in 1913 were Superior, River Falls, Stevens Point and La Crosse, which were to become known as the Northern Division; with Oshkosh, Whitewater, Milwaukee and Platteville constituting the membership of the Southern Division. Each division determined its champion, and then met for a play-off game or a series, mainly in football and basketball. These championship games were played the first year of the organization and for many years thereafter.

To insure faculty control of athletics, the constitution stated that each institution shall have one representative and one vote; also that the representative must not be one who is paid primarily for services connected with athletics and with the physical education department of the university.

From the original membership of eight, the conference increased to 10 schools. Stout Institute, now University of Wisconsin-Stout, became a member in 1914, and the first record of membership of the then Eau Claire Normal was in January 1917. These two, along with the original eight, maintained continuous membership over the years until June, 1964, at which time the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (formerly Milwaukee State Teachers College) terminated its membership in the conference.

In July 1966, Fred Jacoby was appointed as the first commissioner of athletics for the conference. With rapidly increasing enrollments, expanding athletics programs, and increased time needed to administer the affairs of the conference, it was a needed and necessary appointment.

In August 1971, Max Sparger replaced Fred Jacoby as commissioner of athletics. In September 1971, the conference member institutions became part of the newly merged University of Wisconsin System. This merger did not, however, affect the operational procedures and constitution of the Wisconsin State University Conference.

In August 1993, Dr. Dennis Keihn was named commissioner following the retirement of Max Sparger. Keihn was succeeded by Dr. Gary F. Karner in 1996.



Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Historical Review

In 1958, the Wisconsin Athletic and Recreation Federation of College Women (WARFCW) was formed for the purpose of coordinating athletic activity among Wisconsin institutions of higher education. This organization followed the national model (ARFCW) in which governance was primarily the responsibility of student leaders. The WARFCW included representatives from: Eau Claire State College, La Crosse State College, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Oshkosh State College, Platteville State College, Ripon College, River Falls State College and University of Wisconsin-Madison. The WARFCW held sports days in archery, badminton, basketball, golf, gymnastics, tennis and volleyball.

In 1966, a motion to form a women's athletic conference was presented, but defeated. Then, in 1969 at the annual convention held at Carthage College (Kenosha), a motion to limit the number of sports days per sport to one was passed. This constituted a state meet in each particular sport. Member institutions were allowed to travel to other member schools for dual meets.

In the winter of the 1969-70 academic year, a number of schools, which are currently members of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WWIAC), participated in a unique state basketball tournament at the then Wisconsin State University at Stevens Point. As a result of playing a partial round robin, three state champions were recognized. The triumvirate championship of basketball, with its sportsday hues, was questioned later in the spring of 1970 at the state track meet involving essentially the same schools. At that meet, Martha van Steenderen (UW-Whitewater), Chair of the Wisconsin State Division for Girls' and Women's Sports (DGWS), appointed Dr. Judy Wilson of River Falls and Dr. Mary Jo Mullen of Stevens Point to investigate Minnesota's intercollegiate athletic organization for women and report back to the Wisconsin Athletic and Recreation Federation for College Women (WARFCW) schools.

Dr. Wilson and Dr. Mullen began their work, with Dr. Wilson contacting the Minnesota contingent and Dr. Mullen organizing the fall 1970 meeting for the presentation of their report. Marty Beck of Bemidji, Sue Day and Joyce Locks of Winona State served as resource people. Dr. Mullen chaired the fall 1970 meeting at Stevens Point to which eleven universities sent representatives.

At that time, an agreement was reached that the development of a conference was needed. Dr. Mullen took the draft of the Constitution of the newly formed WWIAC and presented it for final approval at a meeting held at UW-Eau Claire on January 29-30, 1971. After two days of deliberations, the WWIAC became a reality. In the spring of 1971, the first "Governing Board" meeting was held.

The original membership consisted of twelve schools (the nine current members plus Carthage College, UW-Madison and UW-Parkside) and grew to its maximum of 16 by 1975 with the addition of UW-Milwaukee, Carroll College, UW-Green Bay and Marquette University.

All members were at one time affiliated with the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW), and the Midwest Association of Athletics for Women (MAIAW). Initially, the AIAW conducted regional and national championships with a large school/small school format. This initial format was later changed to a three division format determined by percentages of financial assistance based on athletic ability.

In 1982, the AIAW dissolved and members affiliated with the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) and/or the NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association), Division III. As of the 1993-94 academic year, all WWIAC institutions had only NCAA Division III affiliation.

In 1975, the University of Wisconsin System allocated a part-time position for coordination of the WWIAC. Gail Grimm was appointed Executive Secretary, and was succeeded in 1977 by Dr. Emogene Nelson (UW-River Falls). It was through Dr. Nelson's efforts that a commissioner's position became a reality. In August 1979, Dr. Janice Stocker became the first WWIAC Commissioner, resigning in August 1984. Judy Kruckman (UW-Eau Claire) served as acting Commissioner until her appointment in June 1985.

In 1984-85, the Conference functioned for the first time as a non-scholarship (no financial assistance allowed based on athletic ability) organization, and Faculty Athletics Representatives acted upon recommendations made by the Athletics Directors.

Judy Kruckman served as commissioner until 1996, at which time Dr. Gary Karner was chosen to oversee both the WWIAC and WSUC.



Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Historical Review

On July 1, 1997 the nine members of the former Wisconsin State University Conference (WSUC) and the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WWIAC) were joined together to form a single conference--The Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Dr. Gary F. Karner was appointed commissioner in July 1996 to direct the merged conferences. Effective with the 2001-02 academic year, Lawrence University joined the conference in the sport of wrestling. Gustavus Adolphus College, Hamline University and Winona State University became members of the conference in the sport of women's gymnastics during the 2004-05 academic year.

The WIAC has continued the record of athletics and academic excellence established by its predecessors. The conference is widely recognized as the premier Division III conference in the country as evident by the number of NCAA championships captured annually by WIAC teams and the overall finish of WIAC institutions in the United States Sports Academy Directors' Cup Division III standings. The conference also has assumed a significant leadership role in the governance structure of the NCAA and has been recognized for its advances in gender equity and the community activism of its student-athletes.

2007-08 All-Sports Award

Three separate All-Sports Awards are presented yearly recognizing the top institutions for men's and women's sports separately, as well as an overall winner recognizing men's and women's combined. The awards are based on the highest total number of points accumulated during the previous academic year beginning with the fall sports and ending with the completion of the spring sports season. Points are awarded according to final standings in each sport on a 9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 basis, 8-7-6, etc., or 6-5-4, etc., depending on how many schools are competing in the sport. Either (but not both) indoor or outdoor track and field are included in the calculations and the awards are determined on the basis of the lowest number of sports offered by any WIAC institution in each category. Award winners for 2007-08 included: Men-Whitewater; Women-Eau Claire; Combined-Whitewater.

WIAC Scholastic Honor Roll

Each academic year, the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference honors individual student-athletes for their outstanding work in the classroom by selecting them to the WIAC Scholastic Honor Roll. The conference office compiles the names of the student-athletes who have qualified for the Scholastic Honor Roll from information submitted by the campuses. A student-athlete has to maintain a 3.0 (B) or better grade point average during the last academic year and compete in at least one athletic contest to be recognized.

WIAC All-Academic Awards

Since 1989, the former Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference recognized the institution with the highest overall GPA for its female student-athletes. In 1998, the WIAC began recognizing the institution with the highest GPA for its male and female student-athletes separately, as well as an overall award combining both the men's and women's programs. Effective with the 2001-02 academic year, the academic honor is presented to those institutions in which the grade point average for its student-athletes is equal to, or greater than, the grade point average of the overall student body. The awards are announced in July for the preceding academic year.
