

# WIAC GYMNASTICS OPERATING CODE

## 2009-10 Season

[Note: The WIAC Sport Codes consist of those policies, procedures and practices unique or specific to the conduct and administration of each conference championship sport, and are intended as **supplements** to the *NCAA Manual*, *WIAC Handbook on the Governance of Intercollegiate Athletics* and the recognized playing rules of each sport, **not** as replacements for them. In addition, football, volleyball and men's/women's basketball have manuals that include expectations related to the administration of those sports.]

### I. RULES

#### A. Conference/National Rules

Coaches are expected to be knowledgeable of and abide by all WIAC and NCAA rules. When in doubt, coaches are expected to consult with their athletics director concerning the application of a rule.

#### B. Contest Rules

FIG Code of Points, USA Rules and Policies, NCAA Code Modifications, NCAA Championship Handbook.

### II. SQUAD AND TRAVEL SQUAD LIMITATIONS

Squad size is unlimited during the season, but may be limited for national competition. Teams must abide by travel squad size established for national competition by the national organization sponsoring the tournament.

### III. SPORT SEASON

#### A. Length of Season/Contest Limitations

Refer to current NCAA Manual [Bylaw 17.11]

#### B. Scheduling

Season scheduling should follow the plan on **Attachment #1**.

#### C. Officials

1. It is recommended that there be two judges per event per meet each with a minimum Level 10 or higher rating. Officials shall be assigned through the Judges Assigning System (JAS) and contracted by the host institution. Host institutions are expected to notify the head coaches of the participating institutions(s) if required level of officials cannot be met.
2. Coaches should use the current USA Fee Schedule as a guideline for payment of officials (refer to <http://www.usa-gymnastics.org/women/rules-and-policies/part5-officials.pdf>). Institutions may pay more if the market demands.
3. The Head Judge and Acting Judge will display the start value of the routine with the competitor's score and put it on the score card during meets throughout the season.

4. All WIAC competitions are to be judged in accordance with the scoring requirements (i.e., open scoring) listed in the NCAA Gymnastics Championships Handbook (Appendix B). Host institutions are required to insert this requirement into the contracts issued to all officials.
5. Officials who are a coaching staff member, works for spouse or relative of a coaching staff member, relative of a current gymnast, member of an institution's athletics booster club and/or gymnastics alumni or former coach that has been away from the program for less than five years shall be precluded from officiating competitions hosted by the involved institution.

**D. Meet Protocol**

Refer to WIAC Gymnastics Meet Protocol for Season and Conference Championship/NCGA West Regional Meets. (**Attachment # 2**).

**E. Rules**

Any rules not specifically covered in this Code shall be covered by the most recent FIG/USA Rules and USA Collegiate Modifications.

**F. Results**

1. For all meets, institutions must report a NCGA score (5 scores) to the conference office for publication on the conference web site.
2. Each institution is required to use the "scorekeeper" statistical software program.

**G. Honor Roll**

The Conference Honor Roll listing will include 20 names for each event and 15 for all-around and will be updated on the conference web site on a weekly basis during the season by the conference office.

**H. Courtesy Sheets**

The exchange of courtesy sheets between institutions prior to a competition is not mandatory and any such exchange is the responsibility of the head coaches.

**IV. CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP/NCGA WEST REGION**  
[See Guidelines for the Administration of WIAC Championships]

**A. Date/Start Times**

The WIAC Conference Championship/West Regional Meet shall be a one-day meet held two weeks (if hosted by a west region institution) or three weeks (if hosted by a east region institution) prior to the NCGA National Championship.

The optimal start times for the championships for Friday, Saturday or Sunday are 5:30 p.m., 4:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m., respectively.

**B. Site**

The site for the WIAC Championship Meet/West Regional will rotate as follows:

**C. Championship Meet Protocol**

Refer to WIAC Gymnastics Meet Protocol for Season and Conference Championship/NCGA West Regional Meets. (See Attachment #2).

[Note: Themes (e.g., Las Vegas) are not permitted.]

**D. Type of Championship**

1. Scoring for the Conference Team Championship will follow the rules of the National Collegiate Gymnastics Association. The meet results will be determined on the basis of five (5) scores.
2. Teams will compete in one session by random draw. The draw will be conducted and distributed by the conference office two weeks prior to the competition.
3. Rotation for Conference Championship/NCGA West Regional:

Warm-up: 18 minutes per rotation in order of competition.

Competition: 3 to 4 minute touch prior to competition on each event depending upon whether the practice facility specifications are identical to the competition facility. This is left to the discretion of the host institution.

4. Equipment must meet USA and NCAA regional and national meet specifications.
5. A back-up sound system should be available for the Conference Meet.

**E. Officials**

1. Meet Referee

- a. Shall have a current Level 10 rating or above;
  - b. May not serve as the meet director or as an event judge;
  - c. Must measure and check equipment, including boards, one half hour prior to the beginning of the timed warm-ups.
2. There should be four Head Judges and four Acting Judges with a USA/NAWGJ Level 10 rating or higher as well as a separate meet referee.
  3. All four events shall run at the same time with Capitol Cup format (if possible).
  4. The host institution shall be responsible for contracting the Championship Meet officials as selected by the JAS assignor. The host institution is responsible for the fees and any lodging and mileage.
  5. The judges shall be paid no less than the USA fee schedule.
  6. Judging will be conducted in accordance with the scoring requirements listed in Appendix D of the NCAA Gymnastics Championships Handbook.
  7. The Jury of Appeals shall be composed of the Meet Referee, the Head Judge of the event in question, and the acting judge of the event. The Jury of Appeals shall handle all protests submitted in writing within five (5) minutes following the event in question.
  8. Judges are expected to verify scores following each rotation as opposed to waiting until the completion of the competition.

**F. Results**

The host institution must distribute results to the coaches, conference office and media immediately following the Championship.

**G. Tournament Committee**

A tournament committee shall be convened to address issues that arise during the Championship Meet which are not covered in the Operating Code. The tournament committee shall be comprised of the commissioner (or designee), the athletics director of the host institution and the sport chair.

**V. Regional Meet**

The West Regional Meet will be conducted in conjunction with the conference championships for the purpose of determining teams and individual qualifiers for the NCGA championships.

**VI. Awards [See WIAC Administrative Regulation Article 25.]**

**A. Conference Championship**

1. Team Champion. A championship award (plaque or trophy) will be awarded to the championship team. Each member of the championship team will receive a certificate.
2. Individual Champions. Medals will be awarded to the top 6 finishers in each of the individual events, and to the top 6 finishers in the all-around competition. The top finisher in the all-around competition will receive a plaque. Ties will be handled in the following manner:

- When ties occur at first, second, third, fourth or fifth place all gymnasts will receive the award of that place. If two athletes tie with the same score, the next place is skipped; if three tie, the next two places are skipped, etc. If ties exist at sixth place, all tied gymnasts will receive the award.

Example: First place, three scores of 9.0 – all receive first place awards, second and third place skipped, fourth place will be awarded. Fifth place, two tied – both get fifth place award and skip sixth place.

#### **B. Athlete-of-the-Week**

Each week during the season, the gymnastics sport committee will select an “all-around” and “specialist” (i.e., individual event competitor) gymnastics athlete-of-the week when nominations and data are sufficient. Each head coach will participate in the weekly vote by submitting his/her to 3 choices from among the nominees to the conference office no later than 9 a.m. on Tuesday. The recipients will receive a plaque from the conference.

#### **C. Coach-of-the-Year**

A coach-of-the-year will be selected by the coaches at the conference championship in accordance with the criteria established in WIAC Administrative Regulation 25.4. The recipient will receive an award from the conference.

#### **D. Scholar-Athlete Award**

A scholar-athlete will be selected at the conclusion of the season in accordance with the criteria established in WIAC Administrative Regulation 25.6. In women’s sports, the award shall be entitled the “**Judy Kruckman Scholar-Athlete Award**”. Each nominee receives a certificate and the recipient will receive an award from the conference

#### **E. All-Conference**

The WIAC All-Conference Gymnastics Team will consist of the top 6 finishers in the all-around competition and the top 6 finishers in each individual event. The top finishers in each event will be awarded an all-conference plaque and the 2-6 finishers will receive a certificate.

#### **F. All Sportsmanship Team**

An All-Sportsmanship team will be named at the conclusion of the gymnastics season. The team will consist of one member from each team (as selected from that team) who displays exemplary sportsmanship throughout the season. Each member of the All-Sportsmanship team will receive a certificate from the conference.

### **VII. SPORT CHAIR/SPORT COMMITTEE MEETING**

#### **A. Sport Chair**

The sport chair shall be the coach from the host institution for the Conference Championship. [See WIAC Administrative Regulation 24.2 for duties and responsibilities of sport chairs.]

#### **B. Gymnastics Sport Committee Meeting**

The gymnastics sport committee meeting following the conclusion of the season will be scheduled by the conference office.

Policies and procedures governing the administration, organization, and conduct of the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Gymnastics regular season and Conference Championship/NCGA West Regional.

## **GENERAL GYMNASTICS INFORMATION**

### **REGULAR SEASON FORMAT**

#### **I. PRE-MEET INFORMATION**

The host institution should e-mail the following information to visiting teams as a courtesy one month prior to a meet:

1. Date, time and site of event
2. Meet format (dual, triangular, quadrangular)
  - a. Number of events being conducted at a time
  - b. Warm-up procedures
  - c. Competitive procedures/time table
3. Directions with map enclosure/parking information
4. Equipment supplied by host institution
5. Locker room facilities available
6. Restaurant list included
7. Names of officials contracted for the meet. Notify coaches via e-mail if any changes should occur.
8. Meet information requested prior to meet
  - a. Line-up
  - b. Exhibitions
  - c. Program and publicity information
9. Athletic Training Services. (provide contact information and list of available services).

#### **II. OFFICIALS**

Refer to WIAC Gymnastics Operating Code (III, C)

#### **III. MEET PROCEDURES**

- A. 4-minute touch warm-ups are optional and should be left to the discretion of the host institution, which should inform the participating coaches prior to the competition.
- B. Line ups should be handed in to the scorer's table at least one hour prior to the start of the competition. Changes in line ups may be made prior to the start of the event by notifying the scorer's table and opposing team.
- C. Once a team begins an event, a substitute may replace an injured gymnast in the same position; the order of competition should not be changed. A gymnast who is removed from one line up may compete in other events (NCAA Handbook).
- D. Coaches may mutually agree on the number of exhibition routines that will be allowed, but will not count for score. Exhibitions should be at the end of the teams competitive rotation (NCAA Handbook).
- E. Score verification should occur at the end of each rotation for the regular-season and the conference championship.

#### **IV. DUAL-MEET FORMAT**

- A. If two events are conducted simultaneously, the home team should begin at vault and the visiting team should begin at bars in the first half of the competition. The home team should begin first on beam and the visiting team should begin at the floor in the second half of the competition. Exceptions would be made for facility or safety reasons.
- B. Warm-ups before the competition should be at least 1 and ½ hours long on the competition floor and apparatus. The first half-hour should be open, and the last hour should be divided into two half-hour segments or four 15 minute rotations. Warm-ups are to be in the same order as the competitions.

#### **V. TRIANGULAR/QUADRANGULAR MEET FORMAT**

### **WIAC/NCGA WEST REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS INFORMATION MEET DIRECTOR'S DUTIES**

#### **A. Pre-Meet Responsibilities for Meet Director**

- 1. Reserve all facilities necessary for the Championship.
- 2. Capitol Cup format.
  - a. Competitive area/Practice area
  - b. Hospitality/Meeting rooms
  - c. Motel accommodations
    - 1) request group discount rates for teams
    - 2) reserve block of rooms for teams and/or officials
- 3. Officials
  - a. Shall be assigned by the JAS Assignor Meet by December 1.
  - b. **Refer to WIAC Gymnastics Operating Code IV, E** for details regarding officials.
- 4. Send pre-meet information packet to visiting institutions, officials, and other appropriate individuals by January including:
  - a. Welcome letter
  - b. Credentials for gate admittance (team members if utilized)
  - c. Tentative schedule of events
  - d. Judges name list
  - e. Specific meet information
    - 1) Rules, eligibility, etc.

- 2) Equipment supplied
  - 3) Sound system—CD or I-pod
  - f. Maps (meet site, gym lay-out, motels, etc.)
  - g. Motel accommodations
  - h. Program information request—Pronunciations of names/March in order
  - i. Ticket information
  - j. T-shirt sales information
  - k. Hospitality services
  - l. Other (concessions, local florists, etc.)
5. Develop a Championship Budget
- a. Expenses may include:
    - 1) Officials (fees, mileage, motel, meals)
    - 2) Equipment rental (moving costs)
    - 3) Printing (tickets, programs, fliers)
    - 4) Hospitality room (food/drink)
    - 5) Decorations/Souvenirs for competitors
    - 6) Custodial services
    - 7) Meet personnel (scorekeepers, announcers)
    - 8) Secretarial assistance (mailings, phone, Xeroxing)
  - b. Potential Revenue
    - 1) Ticket sales
    - 2) Program sales
    - 3) Concessions
    - 4) Souvenir sales
    - 5) T-shirt sales
6. Notify appropriate individuals in advance (dates, times, meetings, responsibilities, etc.)
- a. Meet referee (send specific meet information)
  - b. Officials
  - c. Athletic Trainers
  - d. Athletics Directors/Senior Woman Administrators
  - e. Meet personnel (custodial staff, volunteers, etc.)
  - f. Invitations sent to WIAC Athletics Directors.
7. Develop committee or assign duties to individuals for the following:
- a. Decorations (gym, judges tables, hospitality room, etc.)
  - b. Clean-up crew
    - 1) After each practice session
    - 2) Before competitors march in
    - 3) In the hospitality area
    - 4) After completion of Championship
  - c. Supervise the responsibilities for:
    - 1) Public relations staff or sports information director (programs, radio, press releases, fliers, publicity, etc.)
    - 2) Team leaders
    - 3) Hospitality hostess (greet visitors and judges)
    - 4) Security
    - 5) Concessions and staff
    - 6) Salesperson (T-shirts, souvenirs, etc.)
    - 7) Timers, Flashers, Runners
    - 8) Head table workers and score keepers (computer, calculators, score sheets)
  - d. Announcer (essential for the flow of the meet and audience appeal) (**refer to Appendix A**).  
Develop a script which includes all details of the meet.
    - welcome and greeting to audience

- introduction of teams, competitors, coaches, WIAC personnel, Athletic Directors, etc.
  - fill-in announcements, i.e., weather conditions, T-shirt sales, concessions for sale, etc.
8. Meet details to consider:
- a. Equipment must meet specifications in both the competition and practice facilities (**refer to USA Rules and Policies Handbook**)
  - b. Meet referee must check equipment prior to practice sessions on Friday including vaulting boards and 27.5” minimums.
  - c. Stop watches at each event to be timed (Bars, Beam, Floor) and for the announcer
  - d. Extra chalk
  - e. Extra landing mats
  - f. Green flags (for judges to notify competitor when to begin)
  - g. Music back-up system and volume controller
  - h. Inquiry forms
  - i. Vaulting table forms to be placed on a scoreflasher.
  - j. Signs (teams, competitors, names, concessions, by stations, locker room directions, etc.)
  - k. Chairs
    - 1) At competitive events and bye stations
    - 2) For judges, runners, timers, etc.
  - l. Roped off areas
    - 1) Audience should not be close enough to distract competitors.
    - 2) Announcer and scoring area should remain clear of spectators, coaches, gymnasts, etc.

## **B. Team Arrival**

1. Meet referee must check all equipment prior to first warm-up session of Flight A.
2. Give each visiting team an updated meet information packet that includes:
  - a. Revisions of any previously sent information
  - b. Official practice session times and event order of rotation
  - c. Jury of Appeals Committee name list (**refer to WIAC Gymnastics Operating Code IV, E, 7**)
  - d. General information (hospitality, florists, T-shirt sale, maps, etc.)
  - e. Meet instructions
    - 1) Judging concerns
      - inquiries
      - vault table used (to flash vault no.)
      - rules
    - 2) Equipment
      - regulations
      - audio system—CDR CDs, tape, I-pod
    - 3) Meet format
      - enclose meet instructions with a map of the gym lay-out
      - warm-ups/rotations/bye positions, etc.
      - march-in procedures
      - competition instructions
      - awards presentations
    - 4) Meet instructions
      - explanation of scoring system, i.e., score cards, computer use, etc.
      - check competitors names/per team
      - score inquiry forms.
    - 5) Coach of the Year criteria
    - 6) Verify Order of Competition  
(**refer to WIAC Gymnastics Operating Code IV, D, 2 and 3**)

- 7) Other
  - T-shirt sale location
  - grab bag distribution
  - programs distributed per team
3. Announcer should give the teams advance warning over the loud speaker as to when warm-ups are to begin so they will be prepared.
4. Announce event rotations for each team during the warm-up sessions.
5. During the warm-up sessions, have someone available to answer any inquiries (audio concerns, bar settings, etc.) to ensure a meet with no problems.
6. Have the clean-up crew clean the gym after the final warm-up session is complete.

### **C. Competitive Championship Event Day Final Checklist for Meet Director**

1. Arrive early to make sure everything listed below is in order:
  - a. Chalk at each of the events
  - b. Equipment
  - c. Computer is set up
  - d. Workers are available
  - e. Open the gym promptly
  - f. Make sure trainers are on duty
  - g. Place inquiry forms on the Head Scoring Table
  - h. Microphone in working order
  - i. Place typed order of rotation on Head Scoring Table for coaches
  - j. Check for any last minute changes in competitive order
  - k. Have the awards table set up neatly with the awards on it for display
    - 1) Arrange the awards in order of presentation
    - 2) Assign an individual the task of understanding the awards system. This person can hand the correct award to the individual who is presenting the award.
2. Announcer should time warm-ups and 3 to 4-minute touch during competition.
  - a. Teams
  - b. Individuals
  - c. Coaches and support staff
  - d. Judges
  - e. Sponsors
  - f. National Anthem
  - g. The announcer should inform teams which event they go to and begin the competition
  - h. Music should be used to rotate the teams from event to event and during the touch warm-up prior to beginning of competition.
  - i. The announcer should be available to post team scores that are visible to the spectators.
3. Someone should be available to post team scores that are visible to the spectators.
4. Score verification should occur after each rotation to prevent a long delay at the conclusion of the meet.

### **D. Conclusion of the Competition**

1. Announce for all competitors to assemble in designated area.
2. All coaches should turn in their Coach of the Year ballots to the conference commissioner or his/her designee.

3. Have all coaches and judges come to the head of the scoring table to sign score sheets.
4. Have the awards stand and awards table placed in front of the audience; selected individuals making the presentation should be prepared.

**E. Presentation of Awards (Refer to Section V in WIAC Gymnastics Operating Code)**

1. The announcer should introduce the individual (i.e., commissioner or his/her designee) who is making the awards presentation.
2. It is recommended that the recognition awards, event awards and team trophies be given in the following order:
  - a. Vaulting, bars, beam, floor, and all-around  
(top 6 are recognized in all around, top 6 on all other events)
  - b. Athletes of the Week
  - c. All-Sportsmanship Team
  - d. Coach of the Year award
  - e. Recognition of all Seniors (Coaches)
  - f. Scholar Athlete award
  - g. Team results
3. The announcer may mention the possibility of any individual(s) or team qualification to post-Conference competition (i.e., National).

**F. Results and Post-Meet Procedures**

1. Be prepared to have copies made for each team prior to their departure.
2. If scoring by computer, use back-up system to prevent the possibility of any problems.
3. Report scores to the media.
4. Distribute checks to the judges.
5. Begin clean-up after visitors leave.

**G. Follow up to the Conference Championships (refer to WIAC Gymnastics Operating Code IV, F)**

1. The meet referee must re-check scores to make sure there were no mistakes made.
2. The meet director must send official results to the WIAC conference office and each member school within 72 hours of the Championship.
3. The meet director should prepare a final report for the sport committee's conference call to include:
  - a. Strengths of the Championship
  - b. Weaknesses of the Championship
  - c. Check that appropriate awards were presented or if any duplicates are necessary to be sent out.
  - d. Future recommendations for the Championship.
4. Send thank you's

**APPENDIX A**

**SCRIPT FOR ANNOUNCER**

Welcome ladies and gentlemen to the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Gymnastics Championship and the NCGA West Regional. Today \_\_\_\_\_ is hosting seven teams.
