

WIAC BASKETBALL OPERATING CODE

2009-10 Season

[Note: The WIAC Sport Codes consist of those policies, procedures and practices unique or specific to the conduct and administration of each conference championship sport, and are intended as **supplements** to the *NCAA Manual*, *WIAC Handbook on the Governance of Intercollegiate Athletics* and the recognized playing rules of each sport, **not** as replacements for them. In addition, football, volleyball and men's/women's basketball have manuals that include expectations related to the administration of those sports.]

I. RULES

A. Conference/National Rules

Coaches are expected to be knowledgeable of and abide by all WIAC and NCAA rules. When in doubt, coaches are expected to consult with their athletics directors concerning the application of a rule.

B. Contest Rules

NCAA playing rules shall govern all basketball games involving WIAC institutions.

II. SPORT SEASON

A. Squad Limits [See WIAC Bylaw 16.1]

The number of student-athletes permitted to participate (practice or compete) in **men's** basketball is limited to 20 (plus allowable additions).

B. Length of Season/Contest Limitations

1. Refer to NCAA Bylaw 17.5 for length of playing season and contest limits.
2. In the sport of basketball, institutions are limited to playing a maximum of seven (7) subvarsity (e.g., junior varsity games). In addition, student-athletes are not permitted to miss class(es) to participate in these contests.

C. Scheduling [See also WIAC Article 17]

The conference basketball schedule shall consist of a double round-robin format with teams alternating the home and away site. Doubleheaders (men and women) will be played on Saturdays with single games on Wednesdays (men and women). Institutions are permitted to change dates of conference games by mutual consent and with the prior approval of the conference office. Postponed games are to be played as soon as is feasible, and shall be played (if possible) during the same term or half of the schedule and order in which they were originally scheduled. The schedule will attempt to incorporate (in priority order) the following parameters:

1. Travel distance (longest trips on Saturdays or on Wednesdays of winter break):

2. No more than four (4) consecutive Home/Away dates
3. Play no more than three (3) teams coming off a 'Bye'
4. Balance of Saturday Home/Away dates
5. Non-mirrored schedule

D. Exhibition Games vs. UW-Madison

Net revenue (i.e., game guarantees minus expenses of the participating teams) realized from the exhibition games will be distributed among those institutions participating in the rotation based on equal shares for men's and women's teams. Institutions with both their men's and women's teams in the rotation will receive two shares while institutions with only one team in the rotation will receive one share. Teams opting out of the rotation will have the opportunity to be inserted into the rotation at such time the previous rotation has been completed.

Teams participating in the annual exhibition games vs. UW-Madison are required to transfer the entire game guarantee to the conference office for processing. Participating teams will be reimbursed for actual expenses within the stipulated limits (with the exception of meals) as opposed to a per diem. The reimbursement allowances are as follows:

Transportation

Transportation will be reimbursed for a single bus at the rate commensurate with the institution's regularly contracted transportation agreement. (A copy of the charter bus company invoice with a cost per mile breakdown must be provided.)

Lodging

Each participating institution is entitled to the reimbursement of a single night's lodging for a maximum of 20 individuals at a rate of \$31.00 per person. (A copy of the lodging invoice must be provided.)

Meals

- 100 miles or less (one way): \$20 per person for a maximum of 20 individuals.
[UW-Oshkosh, UW-Platteville, UW-Whitewater]
- 101-160 miles (one way): \$30 per person for a maximum of 20 individuals.
[UW-La Crosse, UW-Stevens Point]
- 161 or more miles (one way): \$40 per person for a maximum of 20 individuals.
[UW-Eau Claire, UW-River Falls, UW-Stout, UW-Superior]

III. GAME MANAGEMENT

A. Starting Times

WIAC basketball games played Monday thru Friday are to start at 7:05 p.m. Start times for weekday games may be changed only in those instances in which an extremely compelling reason is presented and approved by the conference office.

Saturday doubleheaders are to be played at either 1:05 p.m. and 3:05 p.m. or 3:05 p.m. and 5:05 p.m., unless an alternative time is mutually agreed upon by the participating institutions and approved by the conference office. Furthermore, the start times may be adjusted to 5:05 p.m. and 7:05 p.m. in instances of

a facility conflict. [Note: The second game of a Saturday doubleheader shall start 30 minutes following the completion of the first game, but no earlier than the designated start time.]

B. Doubleheader Rotation

The order of play (men or women) for the Saturday doubleheaders will be alternated each season. Consequently, the women's teams shall play the first game and the men's teams the second game of the Saturday doubleheaders during the 2009-10 season.

C. Game Ball

The Wilson (Solution) is the official game ball for all WIAC games. The host institution shall provide and retain possession of the game ball(s). The host institution also must provide a minimum of six (6) game-type basketballs to the visiting team for warm-up purposes. [Note: Due to the stamping of the Conference logo, all ball orders should be processed by June 1. Failure to do so may result in receiving basketballs without the logo.]

D. Game Officials

1. All game officials will be assigned through the conference office for both conference and non-conference games. The conference will utilize 3-person officiating crews and the officials are to be paid directly by the host institution at a rate of \$145/official. [Note: This rate will increase to \$150/official for the 2010-11 season.] Officials working a preseason scrimmage against outside competition are to receive ½ of the regular-season game fee.
2. Head coaches and neutral observers are expected to complete and forward a written evaluation via the www.arbitersports.com system of the officiating crew to the conference office within 24 hours following the contest. [See Attachments #1 and #2.] Coaches also will have the opportunity to complete a mid-year and final evaluation on each official. [See Attachment #3.]
3. As a courtesy to the officials and a double check for scheduling and assignments, the host institution must send a reminder postcard/letter or call the assigned officials at least one week prior to the game. Any discrepancies in assignments should be reported immediately to the conference office.
4. If an official has not reported 75 minutes prior to the scheduled game time or is injured during a game and cannot continue, the game administrator should solicit from the spectators a WIAC registered official as a replacement. If no such official is present, the game administrator should attempt to contact a WIAC registered official from the immediate area, if time permits. If that attempt is unsuccessful, a competent official (e.g., official from another collegiate conference) should be recruited from the crowd or surrounding area. As a last resort, the game is to be officiated by one fewer official.

E. Table Personnel

1. The official table shall be centered at mid-court and off the playing area. Seating at the official table shall be restricted to essential personnel only (e.g., timer, scorer, shot-clock operator, PA announcer).
2. The timer, scorer and shot-clock operator are to be trained and competent individuals. The official scorer **must** wear a black and white striped shirt or jacket.
3. The PA announcer should be a trained adult who knows the officials' signals and can be informative, yet unemotional and impartial.
4. The timer, scorer, and shot-clock operator shall report to the official table 20 minutes prior to the start of the game to meet with the game officials.

5. Equipment and/or materials to be available at the official table shall include the following:
 - a. Current NCAA Basketball Rule Book.
 - b. Printed Instructions for scorers, timers, and shot-clock operators.
 - c. Official NCAA scorebook with pencil(s).
 - d. Timing and scoring controls including shot-clocks and alternate possession arrow devices.
 - e. Complete rosters from both teams.
 - f. Stop watch (in the event the regular clock malfunctions).
 - g. White towel(s).
 - h. White 12" x 18" time cards with black numbering 35 (M) or 30 (W), 20 and 5 on each side.

F. Floor/Locker Room Access

1. Single Games: Visiting teams are to be granted floor access (with baskets down and balls available) 90 minutes before the scheduled start time.
2. Doubleheaders: Visiting teams (both men and women) are to be granted floor access 2 hours prior to the start of the first game of a doubleheader for a period of 60 minutes. Home teams may not be on the floor or in the gym during this 60-minute time period even in instances in which neither visiting team is using the floor.
3. Conflicts: Floor access as prescribed above may not be possible if there is a legitimate preliminary contest (e.g., JV game, alumni game) or other athletic event taking place in the facility. If such an event is taking place and might cause a delay in access to the floor, the visiting team should be notified at least 48 hours ahead of time. In cases in which floor access is not available, neither the home team nor the visiting team is permitted use of the game floor or an alternative floor during the 90 minute pre-game period.
4. Walkthroughs/shootarounds. Access to the floor for walkthroughs/shootarounds outside of the pre-game timeframes listed above (e.g., early morning, night before) may be granted at the discretion of the host athletics director. Such arrangements must be made at least 24 hours ahead of time.
5. Locker room access is to be provided to visiting teams 2 hours prior to game time.
6. Fans and other non-team personnel are not to be granted access until such time the facility is officially open.

G. Pre-Game Format and Half-time Activities

1. Pre-game activities must conform to the format prescribed by the conference [**See Attachment #4.**]
2. All games between conference institutions shall include a fifteen (15) minute half-time interval. Shortening or lengthening the 15 minute half-time interval is not permitted.
3. Special ceremonies (e.g., Parents' Day Introductions) may not interrupt the 20-minute countdown to game time unless agreed upon by both participating institutions and approved by the conference office. Special recognition events that take place within and do not alter the prescribed pre-game format or take place during the 15 minute half time period do not require approval from the opposing coach or institution. Preferably, ceremonies and introductions are to take place during the 15 minute half-time.

H. Preliminary Basketball Games

Preliminary basketball games (e.g., JV games) must be terminated at least thirty-five (35) minutes before the starting time of the varsity game. If necessary, the half-time of the preliminary game should be shortened and/or the last three minutes played without stoppage of the clock.

I. Game Uniforms

The home team will wear white/light jerseys and the visiting team shall wear colored/dark jerseys unless prior arrangements are made.

J. Dressing Rooms

1. Team dressing rooms that ensure a reasonable level of privacy should be provided to visiting teams with access prior to and following the game as well as during half-time. If possible, a chalkboard should be available in the dressing room.
2. Secure and private dressing rooms (with shower), separate from the teams, should be provided to the game officials. Two dressing rooms may be necessary if one female and one male official have been assigned. Provisions should be made for locking this room during the game. Either the officials should be provided with a key, or an attendant should be available to open the room at the half and end of game. Clean towels are to be available for use by the officials.

K. Hosts for Visiting Team and Officials

It is recommended, though not required, that the host institution assign a responsible adult or student (e.g., WIAC Ambassador) to serve as a host/greeter to both the visiting team and the officials. The host could, if necessary, provide parking space(s), direct the visiting team and officials to their locker rooms, provide towels, soap, soft drinks following the game, and be available for any other assistance.

L. Bands, Cheerleaders and Noisemakers

1. Pep bands are to be seated at the end of the courts (if possible) and nearest to the home team's bench. Sound system speakers are not to be positioned behind or near an opposing team's bench. Visiting teams wishing to bring their pep bands must have prior approval from the host institution's director of athletics. Musical instruments are not to be played during a "live ball".
2. Cheerleaders may not occupy the area in front of the visiting teams' bench or the free throw lane extended during free throw attempts.
3. Noisemakers that resemble the sound of a whistle are expressly prohibited. Other types of noisemakers are permitted at the discretion of the host institution's athletics director.

M. Tickets/Seating

1. Tickets and/or passes for visiting teams are to be allocated in accordance with the provisions of WIAC Bylaw 27.1.4. If requested, any number of tickets up to 200 shall be allocated to visiting teams for conference basketball games. If possible, tickets allocated to the visiting team should be designated for a specific seating section behind their own team's bench so as to minimize the contact between fans of the opposing teams.
2. The visiting team shall be provided a minimum of fifteen (15) seats in its designated bench area.

N. Rosters

The visiting team must send its roster of players to the host institution at least 72 hours prior to the scheduled game. The rosters of both teams must be entered into the official scorebook prior to the arrival of the table personnel (i.e., 20 minutes prior to the start of the game).

O. Player Ejection Procedure (Fighting)

1. The official informs the player, the head coach, and the scorer that an ejection for fighting was issued (the scorer notes the time of occurrence in the official score book).

2. The official is to call the commissioner immediately after the game and report the ejection. Officials should be prepared to file a written report on the incident if requested to do so by the conference office.
3. The commissioner contacts the athletic director(s) of the team(s) involved.
4. Player ejection procedures should be handled quickly since the eligibility of the player(s) is impacted with a second fight.
5. Any involved players must be held out of the next scheduled game even if the commissioner has yet to contact the athletics director.
6. A suspended player is permitted to attend the game(s) from which the player is suspended, but is not allowed to sit on the team bench.

P. Spectator Disruption of Basketball Contest (See WIAC Basketball Officials' Manual.)

Q. Debris on the Floor during Basketball Contest (See WIAC Basketball Officials' Manual.)

R. Time-out Procedures (See WIAC Basketball Officials' Manual.)

IV. SCOUTING AND VIDEO-TAPE EXCHANGE

A. Scouting Reports/Film (See also WIAC Administrative Bylaw 27.8.)

Conference schools are not to provide scouting reports or film on other conference schools to non-conference opponents.

B. Film Exchange.

1. All WIAC conference games and (home) non-conference games are to be uploaded by the host institution no later than noon of the following day via the conference's designated film exchange system (i.e., *Game Tape Exchange—GTX*).
2. Away non-conference games are to be uploaded no later than 24 hrs. following the team's return to its home campus. If the non-conference opponent is also a GTX client, this requirement may be fulfilled by that opponent uploading the game on the GTX system.
3. Uploaded video will be retained on the Game Tape Exchange server as an "open library" accessible only by other WIAC institutions, the conference office staff, the WIAC Coordinators of Officials and WIAC game officials.
4. The following procedures are to be followed in the filming of games:
 - a. Film from the middle of the court unless facility cannot accommodate a mid-court set-up. If possible, tape from the official table side of the court.
 - b. Uniform numbers from both teams shall be clearly identifiable.
 - c. All 10 players, in the half-court, must in the camera's view.
 - d. In full-court situations, the video should show as many players as possible.
 - e. There is to be a 15 second leader at the start of the tape so that the beginning of game is filmed.
 - f. The recording should start about five (5) seconds before the ball is put into play from dead ball situations.
 - g. Care is to be taken to ensure that all inbound plays and free throw situations are filmed.
 - h. The camera should remain running for entire game except during extended timeouts and delays.
 - i. The scoreboard must be filmed, showing time remaining and score, at least three (3) times per half and at every timeout.

C. Other Videotape Requirements

Video crews/personnel are expected to continue taping through the post game handshakes and until both teams have left the court. Any time an altercation occurs, the tape should be focused on the incident until order has been restored.

D. Noncompliance

Failure to comply with the conference's prescribed policies on film exchange are to be reported to the conference office and may result in the offending team forfeiting the right to access game film for an indefinite period to time.

V. CONFERENCE CHAMPION/NCAA AUTOMATIC QUALIFIER

A. Conference Champion

In men's and women's basketball, the regular-season champion will be declared the WIAC Champion. If two or more teams are tied, they shall be declared co-champions.

B. NCAA Automatic Qualifier

A postseason tournament will be conducted for the purpose of determining the conference's automatic qualifier into the NCAA playoffs (See WIAC Postseason Basketball Tournament Handbook). Should the tournament be terminated prior to its completion, the automatic qualifier will be awarded to the regular season champion (or number one seeded team).

VI. AWARDS

A. Conference Championship

A championship award (plaque or trophy) will be awarded to the championship team(s). Each member of the championship team(s) will receive a certificate.

B. Postseason Tournament Champion

A trophy will be presented to the team winning the postseason tournament. Each member of the postseason tournament championship team will receive a certificate.

C. Athlete-of-the-Week

Each week during the regular season, the men's and women's basketball sport committees will select a male and a female basketball athlete-of-the-week (AOW) from among nominations submitted by each institution in accordance with the procedures listed below. The recipients will receive a plaque in recognition of their selection.

Men – The AOW will be determined on the basis of a vote of the men's basketball sport committee within the timelines stipulated by the conference office. Each head coach will vote for two (2) individuals in rank order among the nominees and coaches will not be permitted to vote for their own players.

Women – The AOW will be determined on the basis of a vote of the women's basketball sport committee within the timelines stipulated by the conference office. Nominations must be submitted on the prescribed statistical form (Attachment #5). Each head coach will vote for one individual and coaches are not permitted to vote for their own players. Any ties will be broken by the sport chair.

D. Coach-of-the-Year

A coach-of-the-year will be selected by the coaches for both men's and women's basketball at the conclusion of the season in accordance with the criteria established in WIAC Administrative Regulation 25.4. The recipients will receive an award from the conference.

E. Scholar-Athlete Award

A scholar-athlete will be selected for both men's and women's basketball at the conclusion of the season in accordance with the criteria established in WIAC Administrative Regulation 25.6. In men's sports, the award shall be entitled the "**Max Sparger Scholar-Athlete Award**". In women's sports, the award shall be entitled the "**Judy Kruckman Scholar-Athlete Award**".

F. All-Conference Team/Player of the Year

The WIAC All-Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Teams and WIAC Players of the Year will be selected by the coaches at the conclusion of the regular season as follows:

Men and Women

- The teams will consist of ten (10) players irrespective of position(s) played.
- Coaches may nominate only players from their own team.
- Only conference statistics will be used in determining placement on the all-conference team.
- Coaches may not vote for their own players, but must vote for a total of ten (10) players on a weighted ballot.
- The ten (10) players with the highest number of points will comprise the all-conference team.
- Any player not selected to the all-conference team, but receiving at least one vote, will be given honorable mention recognition.
- The three players with the highest vote total will be placed on a ballot for WIAC Player of the Year. The recipients will receive an award from the conference.
- All-Conference selections will receive a plaque. Honorable mention selections will receive a certificate.

Men Only

- A player must have competed in at least one-half of the games played by his team that year to be eligible.
- Selections to the all-conference team will be listed by descending order of votes.

Women Only

- All-Defensive Team. Each coach may nominate up to three players for the all-defensive team. Each coach must vote (in rank order) for five players with the five players with the highest vote totals being selected. Coaches cannot vote for their own player(s).

G. All-Sportsmanship Team

An All-Sportsmanship team will be named at the conclusion of the basketball season. The team will consist of one member from each team (as selected from that team) who displays exemplary sportsmanship throughout the season. Each member of the All-Sportsmanship team will receive a certificate from the conference.

VII. SPORT CHAIR/SPORT COMMITTEE MEETINGS

A. Sport Chair

The sport chairs for the men's and women's basketball sports committees will be selected annually by their respective sport committees. The term of the chair shall be from July 1 to June 30. [See WIAC Administrative Regulation 24.2 for duties and responsibilities of sport chairs.]

B. Basketball Sport Committee Meeting(s)

The men's and women's basketball sport committee meetings will be conducted on the same day following the completion of the basketball season. The men's and women's sport committees may meet as a joint committee for a portion of the day to discuss issues of common interest.
